Dear Sir/Madam,

As directed by the Council, as per provision in Sec. 10(b) in Part III of Bye-Law II, proposals are invited from the Fellows of the Society in good-standing for filling up the vacancies in the Council (Office-Bearers and Ordinary Members of the Council). Proposal Forms for submission of proposals for filling the vacancies are enclosed. Please write "**Proposals**" on the envelope containing your Proposal Forms and send the same so that it may reach the office of the Society on or before **August 16, 2019**. In this connection your kind attention is drawn to the following :

- 1) The Proposal Form must be duly filled in and completed in all respects, otherwise it may be rejected.
- 2) **Correct Fellowship Number of the proposer, seconder and the persons proposed must be quoted in the Proposal Form at the proper places.**
- 3) A CTS Bank Draft/Multicity CTS Cheque of Rs. 1,000 for each post of Office-Bearer and Ordinary Member of the Council on any bank at Kolkata is to be issued in favour of *Indian Chemical Society* should be sent along with the proposal form(s) for each of the vacancies for which proposals are submitted or the persons proposed may be requested to send the amount to the Society. **The CTS Bank Draft/Multicity CTS Cheque should reach the office of the Society on or before August 28, 2019.**
- 4) Each contestant shall get a voter list free of cost.

Attention of the Fellows is also drawn to the following :

**Bye-Law I, Part IV, Sec. 20(a) :**

"Every Fellow so long as his annual subscription be not in arrears shall have the right and be entitled to (i) be present and vote at all meetings of the Society, (ii) propose candidates for election to the Society and (iii) contest for election to any of the offices of the Society."

**Bye-Law II, Part III, Sec. 10(c) :**

"Each proposal shall be duly proposed by at least one Fellow and seconded by another and shall *inter alia* contains the qualifications, official designation, address, and a brief statement of the experience of the person proposed. The consent of the person proposed should either accompany the proposal or reach the Honorary Secretary within seven days after the last date for submitting the proposal; otherwise the proposal shall be invalid."

**Art. IV, Sec. 5(a) and (b) of the Constitution :**

"5(a). Only the Fellows of the Society, who have been duly admitted and whose payments of subscription is not in arrears and who are resident in India shall have the privilege of voting at any meeting of the Society, and to contest and be elected to any of the offices of the Council of the Society."

"5(b). The annual fellowship subscription shall become due on the first day of January every year. Any one who fails to pay the subscription on or before March 31 in any year shall lose the right of voting and for holding any office of the Society in that year and other privileges of Fellowship."

**Art. VIII of the Constitution** (Considering the amendments made by the Extra Ordinary General Meeting dated 24.05.2016) :

"Sec. 1(a). The President shall hold office for three years from 1st January following the Annual General Meeting at which he is so elected. If the Annual General Meeting is delayed by any reason, he/she will hold the office immediately after the Annual General Meeting in which he/she is so elected."

"(b). He/she will not be eligible for election to any of the posts of the Council thereafter. **The President shall upon the expiration of his term of office as President becomes an Advisor. He and all other Advisors (past Presidents), will enjoy all the privileges of the Council Member.**"

"Sec. 3(a). The Vice-President, like the President, shall hold office for a period of three years."

"(b). He/she will be eligible for re-election to the post of Vice-President only for one more term. A Vice-President can hold this office only for two terms in his/her life-time since 2010."

"Sec. 4(a). The Honorary Secretary shall hold office for a period of three years from 1st January following the Annual General Meeting in which he/she is elected, and shall be eligible for re-election for only one more term in his/her life-time since 2010."

"(d). The Honorary Secretary must be a resident at the Headquarters of the Society."

"Sec. 5(a). The Honorary Treasurer shall hold office for a period of three years and shall be eligible for re-election for one more term only in his/her life-time since 2010."

"(c). The Honorary Treasurer must be a resident at the Headquarters of the Society."

"Sec. 7(a). The tenure of the Ordinary Members of the Council shall be three years after which they shall not be eligible for re-election as Ordinary Members of the Council until after the lapse of at least three years. Any Member can seek election to the post of Ordinary Member of the Council only for two terms in his/her life-time since 2010."

**In accordance with the rules of the Society the following members are not eligible to contest the election to the respective offices against their names.**
