Preamble: <p>The cherished dream of J. N. Mukherjee, J.C. Ghosh, and S.S. Bhatnagar to establish a Chemical Society was transformed into a reality with active cooperation of many of the leading personalities in the country, and the Indian Chemical Society was founded on May 9, 1924, as a registered Society, with Sir Prafulla Chandra Ray, fondly called Acharya Ray, the doyen of chemical sciences in India, as the first President. Acharya Ray, after returning from Edinburgh first joined the Presidency College, Kolkata in 1889 and later in 1916, joined the Department of Chemistry, newly formed University College of Science, University of Calcutta as the Palit Professor of Chemistry. He was intimately associated with the Indian Chemical Society till the last breath. The school of chemical research established by him in the University College of Science, where he used to live in the later part of his life, subsequently spread over the entire country through his many illustrious disciples. Acharya Ray had always strongly advocated for effective interactions between industries and academia. He himself was the founder of Bengal Chemical and Pharmaceutical Works Ltd. The development of Chemical and Pharmaceutical industries is one of the important areas to uncover the job opportunities of Indian youths. "By his own contributions to science, but especially by his personal influence, Sir Prafulla was, more than anyone else, responsible for the great development of scientific research in India during the past fifty years." (Nature, 1944, 154, 76). He also founded the Indian Chemical Manufacturers Association (now renamed as Indian Chemical Council).</p>

Else an application for the appropriate membership along with fees must accompany the nomination. All awards are for the benefit of the Indian Chemical Society and its members including honorary fellows.

2. The candidate for the award must be nominated by a proposer who has a personal knowledge of the nominee's contribution at the highest level in the field of specialization and the criteria laid down for the award. A candidate can be renominated in all 3 times. There will be a cooling period of 2 years thereafter.

3. The nominee must be a fellow of ICS or Head of Institute or Fellow of any of the four national academies including INSA, NASI, IASc and INAE.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS TO NOMINATORS

Proposers may please ensure that the nomination form is duly completed and information as required by the Academy is sent ONLY as soft copies to ics.correspondence@gmail.com

- The Nomination is to be signed by **the Fellow of Indian Chemical Society, or Fellow of any of the four National Academies or Head of Institute based personal knowledge** of the scientific or professional attainments of the nominee. The nature of personal knowledge must be specified in the proforma; it could also be attached as a separate document on official letter head and appended to this nomination form at the end. Only a single file should be prepared and named as given before.
- The nominee must be a life member or life fellow, or student member depending on the category of the award. If the candidate is a non-member, a separate membership form must be submitted along with this nomination, otherwise it will be rejected. The office of the Indian Chemical Society will verify if the nominee is a member or not and ask for submitting application for membership.
- The current members of the Council of the Indian Chemical Society including office bearers are not eligible for any awards and should not be nominated.
- The nomination is to be sent duly completed in all respects by the Proposer to the office of the Indian Chemical Society by email so as to reach not later than the date mentioned by midnight. No hard copies are required.
- All entries in the nomination form should be completed. Nominations which are not complete in all respects and not accompanied by a List of Publications (including a list of up to ten most important publications). No correspondence thereafter will be entertained.
- A nomination will remain valid for consideration for 3 years. A renomination can only be made after waiting for a period of 2 calendar years.
- The last date is strictly followed. Nominations received by midnight on the last date of 31st July every year, will only be considered. Nominations will be open on 1st May every year.
- The decision of the Council of the Indian Chemical Society will be final, and no further correspondence be entertained.
- The President of the Indian Chemical Society will have the right of nominating deserving candidates who will enhance the prestige of the Award if a suitable nomination is not received.
- Not more than TWO nominations can be made by a fellow of ICS or other Academies. Only one nomination should be sent for any given award. However, Head of Institute can nominate up to 5 candidates for different awards.
